Cultivation Corner

Fertiliser

Lavenders and Lavandins are lime-loving, growing on limestone-based soils in their natural habitat. They grow and yield best where there is adequate calcium in the soil. Lime may be added in autumn or be incorporated before planting.

If in doubt, have your soil tested before applying any fertilisers. Blood and bone is also beneficial as a nitrogen source and a well-balanced compost is also good idea.

Avoid using excessive amounts of fertiliser (including nitrogen-based fertilisers) and never use strong manures (e.g. pig or chicken).
